Chain of Responsibility is everyone's responsibility. It is our commitment to eliminate and minimise risks to workers and the public relating to transport operations.

At McNab, we are committed to maintaining the standards outlined within Heavy Vehicle National Law Act 2012 (Qld) , as well as the expectations placed on us from our clients, the community, and relevant WHS legislation.

The McNab Chain of Responsibility Plan ensures we:

- All take personal responsibility as part of safety leadership.
- Do everything that is reasonably practicable to ensure safe practices of transport activities.
- Assess and remove any public risk relating to vehicle movements.
- Apply appropriate risk assessment management principles.
- Influence on how goods are delivered or received in accordance with CoR and WHS laws.

Additionally, we aim to:

- Implement systems and processes to achieve Chain of Responsibility compliance.
- Foster a positive, proactive safety culture throughout McNab and with our subcontractors.
- Integrate Chain of Responsibility obligations and care into all our business activities.
- Promote stakeholder engagement through open communication, consultation regarding Chain of Responsibility.
- Ensure awareness of policy and responsibility of all McNab staff and subcontractors.
- Ensure managers , supervisors and workers are instructed regarding their CoR responsibilities.
- Actively prevent breaches of CoR laws to eliminate arrangement's that may cause other parties to break the law.
- Provide ongoing training for managers and staff to safely perform their work duties.
- Ensure that our people are trained and understand their duties/obligations in the CoR.
- Ensure we monitor and review policy and procedures and change when needed.
