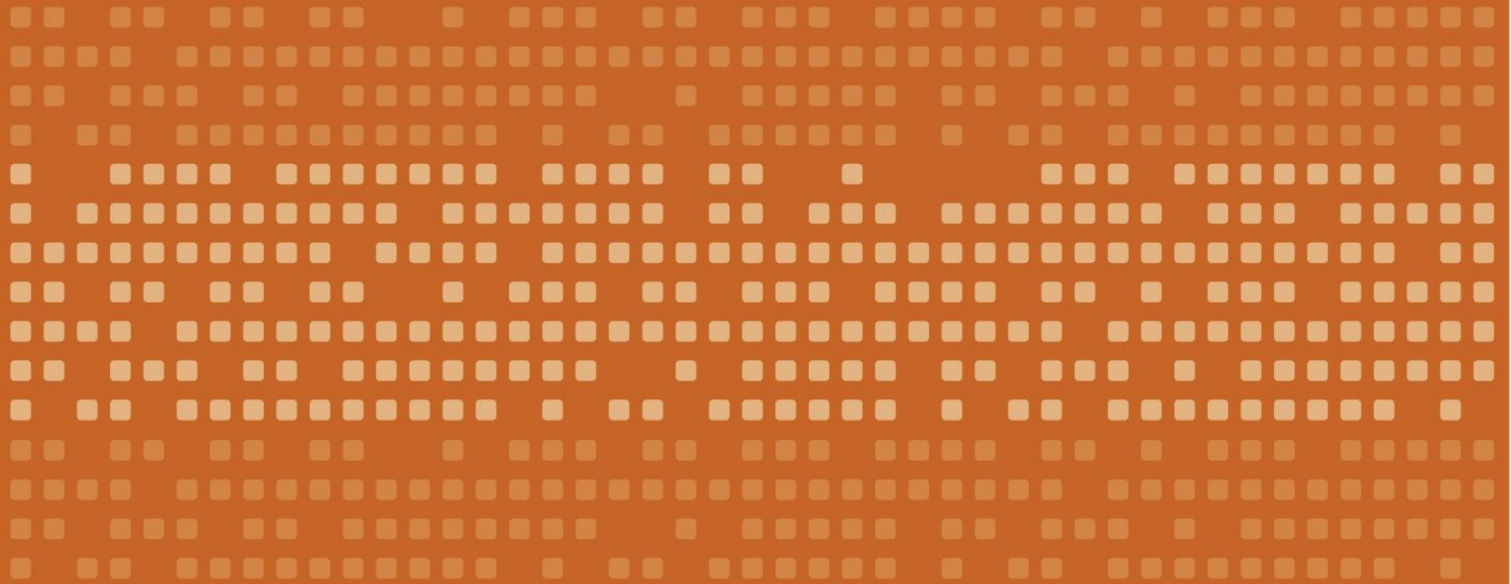

STUDENT QUESTIONS – REGISTRATION AND LICENSING

1. Please state if the below statements are true or false:

Plant listed in Schedule 5 (Part 1) of the WHS Reg 2011 must be design registered before it can be used or supplied	
High risk work licences issued in Queensland are only recognised in Queensland	
A high risk work licence is not needed to operate a forklift truck	
Design and plant registration numbers issued by other health and safety regulators are recognized in Queensland	
Applications for plant registration are required to include a declaration that the item of plant has been inspected by a competent person and assessed by that person as being safe to operate ('safe to operate' statement).	
The design registration holder or supplier must provide the design registration number with each item that is supplied.	
If a person relinquishes control of plant, they must provide all records of the plant to the person taking control of the plant
